## A Vision for Housing Justice: Youth-Led Report Launches at The Eliza



On a bright April morning, a meaningful event unfolded in the heart of Inwood at The Eliza—The Children's Village's newest deeply affordable and beautiful development. Hosted by The Children's Village in partnership with youth advocates and affordable housing developers, the gathering marked the launch of Housing Justice for Young People Aging Out of Foster Care in New York City—a bold, youth-driven plan to end the foster care-to-homelessness pipeline.

More than just a report, the five-year plan outlines a path to create 800 dedicated housing units for young adults transitioning out of foster care. Supported by the Hilton Foundation and coauthored by The Center for Fair Futures, HR&A Advisors, and Good River Partners, the report is grounded in data, policy analysis, and most importantly, the voices of young people who have lived through the system.

Each year, hundreds of young people in New York leave foster care with limited support and few housing options. New York has one of the most competitive housing markets in the country—alone. The young leaders who helped shape this report know that reality all too well. Their lived experiences not only informed the findings, they drove the vision. These advocates made it clear: true housing justice offers choice, dignity, and opportunity.

They called attention to long-standing inequities, noting that 85% of affordable housing is still concentrated in the most heavily burdened communities. Instead, they championed a new model— one that places youth in safe, integrated communities with access to strong schools, reliable transportation, and economic opportunity.

Because at the heart of this work there is a simple truth: where you live shapes your future.

The Children's Village is actively working to support young people as they transition out of foster care by building beautiful, affordable homes located in desirable areas.

# **Celebrating Milestones and Empowering Futures**

Across The Children's Village community, this graduation season was filled with joy and reminders of how much our young people can achieve. From high school seniors at Greenburgh Eleven to peer leaders in our Teen Choice program, every cap tossed in the air represented success and transformation.

At our Dobbs Ferry campus, **Greenburgh Eleven** students crossed the stage, cheered on by families, staff, and supporters. "Today is about moving on to actual life," said Jack, a graduating senior and proud scholarship recipient headed to Onondaga Community College. "Although it might be difficult, there is always a light at the end of the tunnel."

His classmate Jaidyn shared, "Before CV, I wasn't really focused. But since I came here, I stayed motivated. I want to change lives—I want to help make sure everyone is prepared for life."

A rising senior, David, who helped with the ceremony, added: "Being involved this year means I'm going to be in the robe next year. I'm excited to be the next, better version of myself."

The celebration was made even more special with a scholarship fund created by Morgan Stanley Fund Services. CV Board member Yvette-Michelle Wynn shared, "It was awarded to a graduating senior, affirming our firm's commitment to empowering the next generation.

Our **Teen Choice** program, which provides consent and healthy relationship education in 35+ NYC schools, also celebrated student success. Marvin, Brooklyn Academy's valedictorian, reflected, "Teen Choice opened up new opportunities, helped me explore the city, and taught me how to support others."

Cici, a peer leader from the High School of Fashion Industries, shared, "Teen Choice helped me feel like I belonged and gave me confidence to help others. I've made connections with the Choice Pantry and will continue to give back. I'll be attending FIT and studying in Florence, Italy next year."

This season of achievement also extended to our **Family Foster Care (FFC)** program, which celebrated 31 graduates from middle school to college. For a program serving just over 250 young people, this is an extraordinary milestone. Highlights include five college graduates and high school seniors heading to schools like Lehman College, UC Riverside, and UConn.

We're proud of every one of our graduates—and grateful to all who help make their journeys possible.

Both Paulina and Korah had powerful messages to share with others — especially to foster children and those considering becoming foster parents.

#### **Empowering Bronx Youth at the Morrisania Health Fair**

This summer, our Teen Choice team was proud to participate in the 3rd Annual Morrisania Bronx Health Fair, connecting with families and youth to talk about healthy relationships, consent, and safe sex education.

Held at Drew Playground next to the NYC Health Department's Morrisania Clinic, the event was part of the city's HealthyNYC initiative—an ambitious, citywide effort to increase life expectancy for all New Yorkers.

Our Teen Choice program promotes education around consent and healthy relationship-building in over 35 New York City middle and high schools, with full-time educators embedded in six schools across the boroughs. Their presence at the Bronx Health Fair allowed them to meet

young people where they are—out in their communities—with information that could truly make a lifechanging difference.

We recognize that a young person's health is shaped by more than individual choices—it's also impacted by generations of systemic inequities. Disinvestment in communities of color has led to neighborhoods with fewer health resources, less access to opportunity, and significantly lower life expectancies.

By taking part in community events like the Morrisania Bronx Health Fair, our staff and youth are helping to close the gap one conversation, one resource, and one relationship at a time.
